**From Tina & Class 4**

Aroha mai, aroha atu. (*Love towards us, love going out from us.*)

Kia ora from Tina and Class Four,

Back at school after the summer holidays, Class 4 began the year studying kōwhaiwhai patterns throughout the Form Drawing main lesson. We learnt of rauru, pūhoro, koru and koiri and created our own designs once we had heard about the significance and meaning of different elements. Having developed an understanding of the very real people represented in the history and the whakapapa of a particular marae, hapu and iwi, this culminated in the design of individual pou.



The children worked so very well, enjoying the many games, songs and rakau actions that accompanied this main lesson. While this main lesson has now come to an end, the theme will continue in our practice lessons where we learn of the many different manaia figures. The children very much enjoyed putting together their own designs in fresh, original and meaningful ways.

In handwork, with Jutta and Kaia, the class was introduced to harakeke weaving and the protocols around cutting, preparing and working with this precious resource.

Later this term we will begin the task of bringing our class whakatauki to life in a sculptural way using found and collected materials like driftwood, harakeke, pumice, shells and uku (clay). Many thanks to Kaia for her generous and enthusiastic support of this project!

For me some of the most encouraging words of advice from the teachers at the Wānanga Kaupapa Steiner conference this summer was to keep searching for the locally held knowledge passed down through the generations, and to find and share the taonga of local stories, songs, craft and tikanga.

So please let your children's teachers know about these stories, tell them to us, or email them to me as a recorded sound file via the school office.

Over the years many founding parents and teachers have built up resources but with the arrival of each new generation it feels important to refresh, remember and rejoice in this unique coast and its people.

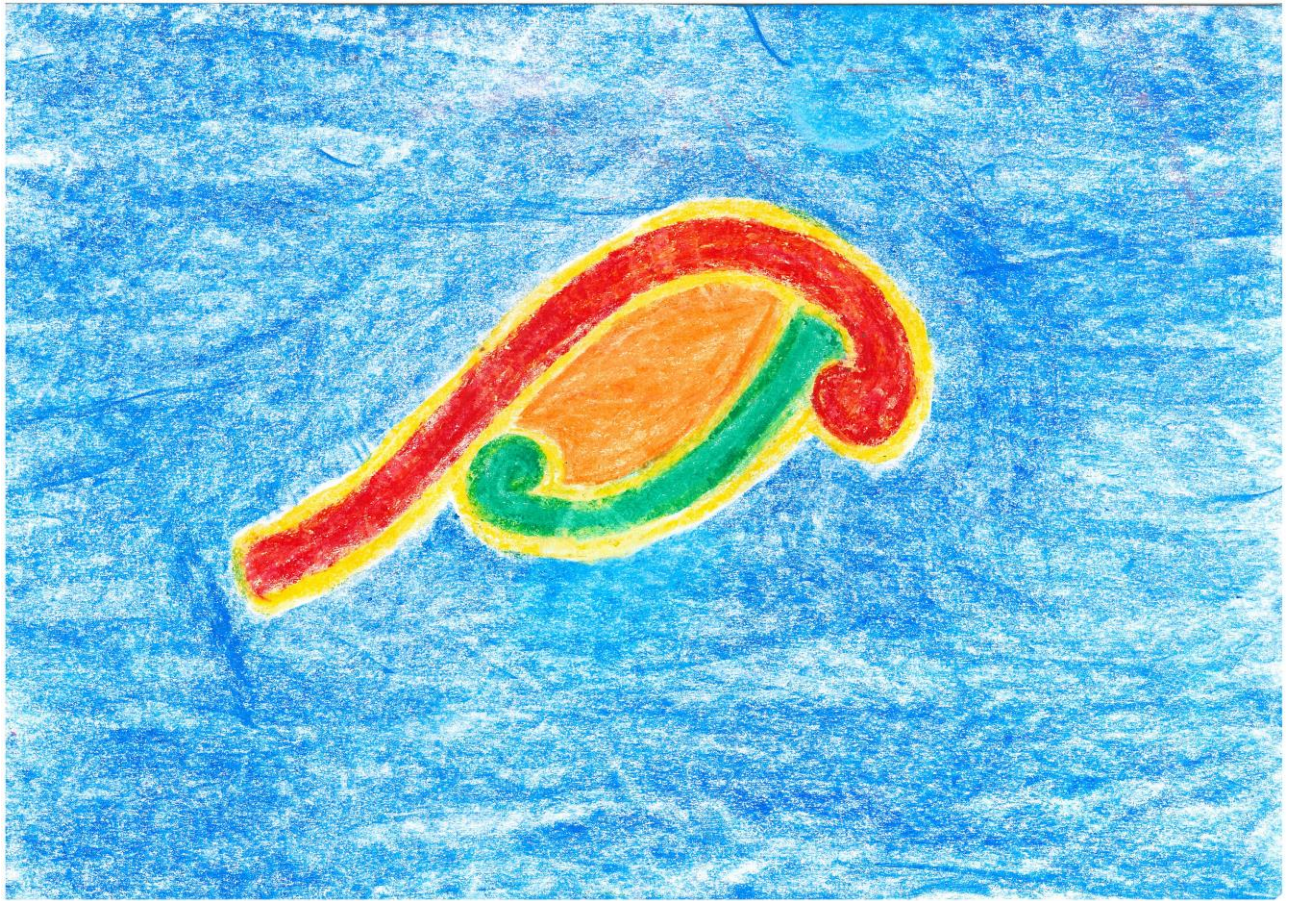
