## Te Rā Beyond the School Gates

As you may recall, last year the then Classes 4 and 5 took part in a project sponsored by the Phillips Foundation, Mahara Gallery and Ngā Manu Bird Sanctuary.

Following last year's exhibition at Mahara, last Wednesday evening a group of children and their families gathered at Bowen House in the Parliamentary Gallery to celebrate the opening there of an exhibition and four previous projects which focussed on conservation and the artistic response of Kapiti Coast children.

The work of 7 of our children - Maja McKenzie, Annamieke Wraight, Raihana Law, Xoya Andrews, Eddie Kemp, Maanu Frost and Max Wooton - was chosen for this prestigious event, while the book containing art work and poems by a number of our children was also on display.

Robin Phillips spoke about his life as a young boy on a farm here on the coast and the freedom, love and appreciation he has for New Zealand's flora and fauna, and how this had informed his work with the World Health Organisation, where, among other projects, he has helped clean up and care for the Mediterranean foreshore. Robin spoke also of his strong belief in the arts as a way of engendering health.

With these factors in mind he placed his family farm into a charitable trust and through a recommendation by Janet at the Mahara Gallery they re-located a classroom to Ngā Manu

and he has been supporting schools, children and their families ever since, thus giving back in practical ways to the children of this coast experiences similar to his own as a growing child and ensuring that historically significant sites like Ngā Manu remain our taonga. Kia kaha - thank you Robin, Janet, the team at Ngā Manu and Jan Logie for sponsoring this exhibition.

The exhibition at Bowen House runs until March 18.
